

## Declaration of non-use of The Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA)

Dear customer,

Herewith we confirm information regarding the Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA), passed in the US in 1976. The Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act, passed in 2016, includes modernizations to TSCA. These special rules serve to implement occupational health protection, environmental protection, and climate protection.

Many countries across the world have adopted common rules on how to evaluate chemical substances and their mixtures. One of these systems is the United Nations Globally Harmonized System (GHS) of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals. TSCA also follows the UN GHS. DAFA Group applies the GHS in line with the associated European requirements.

Suppliers provide DAFA Group with Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for chemical substances and mixtures. Based on these, we assess raw materials and calculate substance content for each item in the bill of materials in close cooperation with our suppliers.

## Statement: vPvB, PBT chemicals TSCA (section 6(h)), and its amendments, effective January 2025

We confirm that, to the best of our knowledge and supplier information, no persistent, bioaccumulative, or toxic (PBT) substances are used or intentionally added in our manufacturing process.

- PIP (3:1) phenol, isopropylated phosphate (3:1) (CAS 68937-41-7)
- DecaBDE decabromodiphenyl ether (CAS 1163-19-5)
- Hexachlorobutadiene (CAS 87-68-3)
- Pentachlorothiophenol (CAS 133-49-3)
- 2,4,6-tris(tert-butyl)phenol (CAS 732-26-3)

This statement is based on the information that is currently available to us. We will continue to monitor updates to the TSCA Regulation to ensure ongoing conformity of our products.
